

What's been happening around Trinity Church?

School Supplies Donations

You were exceptionally Generous! Thanks to the people of Trinity Church, ten students at Blackhurst Elementary School will have new, age-appropriate backpacks filled with the supplies they need to start school well-prepared. (A surprise: Including well-made, age-appropriate backpacks, supplies, for elementary students this year are running nearly \$100 per child—and Trinity covered that cost).



Christmas in July

was a treat! We combined a call for composition books to be given to ECM (Episcopal City Mission: Chaplaincy to Youth in Detention) at Christmas time with a carol sing-a-long. The Carol-Sing lasted about 90 minutes, concluding with a duet, “O Holy Night,” sung by John Hawn and Judy Hodge, and accompanied by Jacob Taylor. Pastor Meg wore an elf-hat and a merry time was had by all. And those early Christmas-gift composition books have filled two good-sized boxes and several bags—200 and counting!

IN AND AROUND THE BUILDING

Tree-Trimming: Hansen’s Tree Service trimmed dead branches from several trees along the parking lot and elsewhere on church grounds, including our beloved flowering crab apple tree and a dogwood. Rick and Jane Lackey dealt with fallen pine tree limbs in the Memorial Garden and trimmed the evergreens along the path next to the building.

Air-Duct Cleaning: Stanley Steemer was here on August 2 to vacuum the ductwork throughout the building. It took two trucks and four young men about five hours to clean ducts in every room.

Organ Tuning: Wicke’s Organ Company spent a full day with John Hawn, tuning and making minor organ repairs. John himself has spent many full days working on various organ “organs” and would be happy to offer tours of the pipes.

Contractor Details: The flooring in the church was cleaned of glue and some issues with the carpet and vinyl tile were addressed. The elevator hallway floor, damaged by flooding from a burst pipe on Ash Wednesday morning, 2021, has been replaced with the same vinyl tile as is in the church. Electrical work was finished. Electronic work with sound, lighting, recording and streaming is ongoing. (Tech Teams are forming! Sign up today!)

The Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

Reader A Reading from the Book of Hebrews

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old-- and Sarah herself was barren-- because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."


All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.




